VICTORIA SPONGE RECIPE:

Weigh 3 eggs. Weigh the same amount of SR flour, caster sugar and butter/margarine. Sieve flour into a bowl, add eggs, sugar, butter/margarine, and ½ tsp of vanilla extract. Beat well, bake in two (approx.) 7" sponge tins. Jam and/or cream filling of choice.

- 4) ENTRY FEE – Adults 50p per entry, Children 20p per entry.
PRIZES will be : 1st - £1.50, 2nd - £1.00, 3rd – 50p
- 5) All exhibitors must provide their own materials.
- 6) All exhibits must have been made/grown by the exhibitor, and MUST NOT have been previously entered in the show.
- 7) No person can have more than one entry per sub-class.
- 8) If there are fewer than three entries in a class, or only one entry, the prize(s) will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.
- 9) The awarding of all prizes is at the discretion of the judges.
- 10) The decision of the judges is final.
- 11) Judging will take place between 12 noon and 2pm on Saturday 22nd August 2026 and the display of exhibits will be open to the Public at 2.15pm.
- 13) Prizes and certificates will be awarded as appropriate.
- 14) Exhibits and certificates should be left on display until 4.25, and removed by 5.30pm. Any not removed will be disposed of.
- 15) Prizes will be awarded in Grosmont Nave as soon after 4pm as possible.
- 16) The organisers cannot be responsible for any loss or damage.
